May 2021 IB Exam Registration

Congratulations on your decision to participate in an International Baccalaureate course of study this year! The IB program offers rigorous college preparatory classes that culminate in exams that will be conducted between April 29-May 21, 2021.

Carmel High School students will be registering and paying for IB exams online using *Total Registration*. You can use this QR Code to go directly to the registration site. \rightarrow Once on the site, complete all the information on the electronic form. After you have completed the registration, please make sure to complete the online payment process. <u>Your registration is</u> <u>not complete until exam fees are paid</u>. Please follow these instructions carefully, as payment CANNOT be made directly to Carmel High School. <u>Regular registration runs October 12th -</u> <u>November 1st, with a late registration window running November 2nd -December 17th.</u>

The list of IB exams that Carmel High School is offering this year is on page two of this letter. If you are trying to decide if you want to take a particular IB exam or not, here are some additional thoughts to consider:

- Can you earn college credit for this course? Scan this QR Code to see common universities and their IB credit. Or you can Google search your college name + "IB credit" to quickly find out if they will give you credit for the IB course you are taking.
- Is it required for your Academic Honors Diploma?
 - You may need to take the IB exam if you are using your IB course to satisfy the requirements of your Academic Honors Diploma. See your counselor if you have any questions about your eligibility status, but here is the information from our CHS Program of Studies:

Students must complete one of the following additional requirements:

- A. Earn 4 credits in two or more Advanced Placement courses and complete the corresponding AP exams, or
- B. Earn 6 verifiable transcripted college credits in dual credit courses from the Indiana priority course list, or
- C. Earn 4 credits in International Baccalaureate courses and complete the corresponding IB exams
- D. Earn a combined score of 1250 or higher on the SAT (Math, Critical Reading and Writing) and a minimum score of 560 on the math and a 590 on the evidenced based reading and writing section.
- E. Earn a composite score of 26 or higher on the ACT and complete the written section.
- F. Earn two of the following:
 - A minimum of 3 verifiable transcripted college credits from the priority course list
 - Earn 2 credits in Advanced Placement courses and complete the corresponding AP exam(s)
 - Earn 2 credits in International Baccalaureate standard level courses and complete the corresponding IB exams.

Steps for Registration:

- Go to <u>www.TotalRegistration.net/IB/150445</u> or use the QR Code at the top of this page.
- Complete the registration form online. You will need your student ID and email addresses for **both you and a parent.** These will be used for confirming your registration information. It is **VERY** important that you fill out registration carefully and accurately.
- Be sure to click on the correct IB exams! For example, do not confuse Film SL and Film HL. Remember that HL exams can only be taken after you have completed the second year of the course. If you register for an incorrect exam, we cannot offer alternate exam testing. Ask your teacher if you have any questions.
- Total Fees: **IB exams are \$130 each.** There will be additional fees charged for any late registrations. The late fee is \$45 per exam. The refund policy is available online at the Total Registration site.
- Students without internet access at home may go to the counseling office to register. Please see Mrs. Van Buren and remember to bring email addresses and payment information to complete registration.

Note: **IB Film, Visual Arts, Theatre, and Music** students will register for exams but will be assessed via a Portfolio of work, rather than through a seated exam in May. Teachers for these courses will assist students in getting portfolio work submitted by the May deadline. Students will still need to register and pay for an "exam" for these courses even though the assessment format is different.
