<u>President's Report – Tishia Smith</u>

- Carnival
 - Carnival preparations are underway
 - The contract with Qtego is good to go
 - The silent auction committee has been in charge of the raffle in the past, but we have a new
 auction chair this year so it's a lot to take on. We're looking for a volunteer to be in charge of the
 raffle; Lauren volunteers to do it.
 - This person would be responsible for reaching out to the teachers about their individual non-tangible raffle items (i.e. ice cream with the teacher) as well as the tangible items.
 - We need items that kids can get excited about. In the past we've done Beats headphones, and an ipad mini. Some new ideas are a kids fitbit and a Nintendo switch. The goal is to have it all done by the end of January
 - We need a project idea to tie to the auction funds that we can promote to local businesses and encourage them to donate. Mrs. Raasch says we can poll the teachers for suggestions.
 - Shaune is working with the games vendor
 - We need more volunteers to help. The volunteer coordinator for Carnival is an open committee position we need to fill

- We need new ideas for carnival prizes. Last year we had ear buds, fidget spinners and stuffed coyotes. We are no longer going to give out balls. We should consider doing one nice item, like a sports blanket, instead of several smaller items.
- Coordinating Council Meeting
 - Volunteers are needed for the Carmel Youth Assistance Program. The district refers families to the CYAP when they need more services than the school can provide. The goal is prevention before the kids end up in the system
 - There is a need for bus drivers and substitute teachers. Retired teachers earn a bit more money and the schedule is flexible.
 - o In the next week, the district is rolling out a new emergency app called "Stop It". It's a two-way system for students and parents to send anonymous alerts to administration and the SRO if they think someone is in trouble. The motto is "see something, say something" if you have a reasonable suspicion, you should report it.
 - o Transition to Power School is Dec. 1st but myccs won't cut off until Jan. 1st.
- We are looking for a co-chair for the math club

<u>Principal's Report – Nikki Raasch</u>

- There were about 20-25 people at Conscious Discipline Parent Night. Mrs. Raasch thought it went well but there is even more we can share. The parents seemed to appreciate it. Mrs. Leckrone was there to talk about school safety but nobody came to her station. Mrs. Raasch thinks parents feel confident about what TME is doing to keep kids safe.
- There were only about 5 people at the last principal coffee. Mrs. Raasch has had requests to do it earlier to accommodate working parents. She will try to do the next one at 7:00 am.
