BOARD MEMBER REPORTS

- Board Secretary, Dr. Lin Zheng, provided an update as a Board Member for Carmel Clay Parks and Recreation. She reported that CCPR has established an advisory Extended School Enrichment (ESE) committee to gather feedback for continuous success of the program. Dr. Zheng also shared that the ESE Program, since 2011, has earned a national designation, "From Darkness to Light," empowering adults to prevent child sexual abuse.
- Board Member, Mrs. Layla Spanenberg, provided a legislative update. She stated that November 19th was Organization Day at the Indiana Statehouse and Red for Ed Day. Mrs. Spanenberg reported that she and Dr. Beresford continue to meet with legislators to discuss common interests in public education. She reported that Hamilton Heights will host the Hamilton County Legislative Luncheon on December 18th. This event brings together local school administrators and board members and state lawmakers.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- Dr. Beresford shared that he was proud of the many CCS educators who attended the Red for Ed Rally on November 19th. He also mentioned that he was proud of the teachers who supported their colleagues by wearing red in the classroom and making sure students had a safe and productive learning environment. He thanked everyone for their collaboration and teamwork.
- Dr. Beresford congratulated the HiLite staff for being named a NSPA Pacemaker Award winner. The HiLite was one of only 19 winners in the country and the only winner from Indiana. The Pacemaker, often called the "Pulitzer Prize of Scholastic Journalism," is one of the most prestigious national awards a journalism staff can earn. This marks the eighth consecutive Pacemaker for the HiLite staff. In addition, the HiLite staff earned two more recognitions. First, seniors Jackie Hur and Hari Patel earned first place nationally in the Infographic of the Year competition. Second, the HiLite staff earned a third place best of show in the large school website category.
- Dr. Beresford congratulated the Greyhound Cheer Team for winning the small group varsity division, which has earned them a bid to the National competition in February.
- Dr. Beresford stated that Carmel High School had a record number of 37 student athletes sign their National Letter of Intent to play their sport at the collegiate level. He congratulated them for their hard work and discipline throughout their high school career. He looks forward to seeing their success in college!
- Dr. Beresford congratulated the CHS Math Club for winning the 54th annual Rose-Hulman High School Math Competition. This victory marked the CHS Math Club's 11th consecutive win. This year, they won every grade level team competition and 22 of the 29 individual awards.
- Dr. Beresford shared that he attended the CCS Spell Bowl Competition. He congratulated all teams on a job well done! He shared that Smoky Row Rockets won the District Spell Bowl and State Spell Bowl with a perfect score of 56! College Wood Elementary placed 3rd in the state and Orchard Park and Prairie Trace placed in the Top 10 in the state.
- Dr. Beresford congratulated the Creekside Spell Bowl team for winning the Indiana Academic State Spell Bowl Championship with a perfect score of 72. It's has been 34 years since a middle school in Carmel has won the State Spell Bowl!
- Dr. Beresford Congratulated the CHS Football Team on defeating Merrillville 38-17. The Greyhounds will be going to the state championship game for the 10th time in the last 14 years! They will play Center Grove for the state title on November 30th at Lucas Oil Stadium.
- Dr. Beresford congratulated middle school students, staff and parent volunteers for a successful and outstanding musical! Creekside Middle School students performed "Bye, Bye Birdie," Carmel Middle School performed "Footloose," and Clay Middle School students performed "The Music Man."
